

HEALTH PROFESSIONS SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Specific eligibility criteria are used to evaluate each applicant in an attempt to admit those applicants with the highest likelihood of success.

Until **15 hours of college course work are completed, including a science course with a lab**, the following criteria are evaluated:

- ✓ high school class rank
- ✓ high school grade point average
- ✓ high school science grades
- ✓ ACT composite score
- ✓ ACT science score
- ✓ English assessment
- ✓ Math assessment
- ✓ college GPA, if any
- ✓ college science grade, if any

If 15 hours of college-level course work are completed, including a science course with a lab, then only the college GPA and college science grade(s) are used.

Parkland College district residents are given first priority. Any remaining seats are given to the highest-scoring, rank-ordered, out-of-district applicants. Next out-of-state applicants are considered; then out-of-country applicants are considered if there are any seats remaining. The **deadline for applications** to be considered for Fall class each year is **March 1st**. **Completed** applications are scored by admissions staff. All qualified applicants are *scored* and notified of their status: either **provisionally accepted, alternate, or does not meet minimum criteria**. Alternate list placement indicates that you may have the opportunity to be offered a seat later, if one becomes available.

HOW DO I APPLY?

- Complete Parkland College application
- Enclose \$20.00 application processing fee with your application. Include your ID number on your check.
- Mail to: ***Parkland College, Admissions & Records, 2400 West Bradley Avenue
Champaign, IL 61821***
- Request all ***official transcripts*** be sent to Parkland College Admissions & Records Office: high school and college transcript(s) if applicable.
- Take Parkland's Assessment Testing for Reading, Writing, and Mathematics; (application must be accepted by the College first) Take pre-nursing test (if applicable) in Sept. or Feb.
Exceptions include:
 - ***Receiving an ACT score of 23 or higher for English, including 4 years of high school English OR completed English 101.***
 - ***Receiving an ACT score of 25 or higher for Math, including 4 years of appropriate high school math
OR completed transferable college level math class within 5 years of application deadline.***

Applicants who are not selected must reapply for a later term by completing a **Request for Health Career Program** form, if they desire to be considered again.
